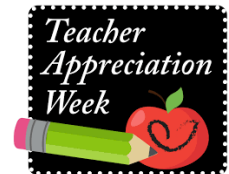

Lumen Christi Academies Update

OAKLAND – Bishop Michael C. Barber, SJ, has appointed Rodney Pierre-Antoine as the founding executive director of the new Lumen Christi Academies, a network of seven elementary schools within the Diocese of Oakland. Pierre-Antoine will begin his work in leading the new network May 14, 2018.

Pierre-Antoine has served as a Catholic educator in the East Bay Area for most of his career, after obtaining a master's degree in educational leadership from the University of Notre Dame in 2009 and his bachelor's in communications in 1998 from the University of Maryland. He has served in leadership positions at St. Felicitas in San Leandro and St. Jarlath in Oakland, and was director of the Notre Dame ACE Academies, a national network.

"I am passionate about my commitment to co-creating an exceptional, Christ-centered community for students and families," Pierre-Antoine said. "I am excited about this opportunity to lead the launch of the Lumen Christi Academies, an innovative model of Catholic education that can serve as a thriving example of excellence for our Church."
